8. EASTERN TERRACE/PROPOSED NO STOPPING RESTRICTION

The purpose of this report is to request that the Board approve for installation a proposed no stopping restriction in Eastern Terrace at the proposed Buxton Terrace pedestrian bridge.

At its November 2003 meeting, the Board resolved that the publicity plan and perspective of a new pedestrian bridge, to replace the existing bridge over the Heathcote River at Buxton Terrace, be approved for consultation and construction.

It has since come to staff's attention that a no stopping restriction is required to preserve adequate space for the through movement of traffic beside the access ramp/landscaping/new kerb to be constructed with the new pedestrian bridge. The consultation leader has spoken with the property owners and residents in the adjacent properties, who are all agreeable with the installation of a no stopping restriction on the east side of the road, but not the west side (i.e. on the same side as their properties).

Having gained the approval of the residents, and being in the interests of traffic safety and movement, it is proposed that a no stopping restriction be installed on the eastern side of Eastern Terrace opposite Numbers 215 to 219.

Recommendation: That the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the east side of

Eastern Terrace commencing at a point eight metres south of the common boundary of Numbers 219/221 and extending in a southerly direction for a

distance of forty-eight metres (48.0 metres).
