COUNCIL CHAMBER ARTWORK (THREE BASKETS OF KNOWLEDGE)

The artist Morehu Henare is working on this project and at our last meeting she was happy with its progress. Completion date is set for 30 June 2004 and installation will be shortly after that.

'RESPECT' - SCULPTURE ON THE CORNER OF LYTTELTON STREET AND LINCOLN ROAD

This work has been named 'Respect' by the artist, Leah Fraser Henderson. The sculpture reflects the history of the site, the waka representing the Mokihi, a form of traditional Ngai Tahu watercraft. The popularity of this form of transport is apparent in the traditional name of the waterway in that area - "O Mokihi" (the place of Mokihi). The waka sits on a bed of volcanic rock showing the layers of generations that have lived in the area. The wrap of stones suggests food baskets and is a reference to the site being a "Mahinga Kai" (food gathering area). The stones inside the wrap are Waimakariri River stone relating to the river one having flowed in that direction. The sculpture is named 'Respect' as it talks about having respect for the past, for the community and for each other.

PROPOSED MURAL - SUMNER

At the Hagley/Ferrymead Community Board meeting on 5 May 2004, Pip Ives from the Sumner Surf Life Saving Club and Ginney Deavoll, an artist, addressed the Board regarding a proposal to paint a mural on the exterior wall of the public toilets, adjacent to the Surf Club facilities.

Ms Ives advised that she would consult local residents on the project and acknowledged that the project would need the endorsement of the Arts, Culture and Heritage Committee.

The Board has endorsed the project, including the design presented by Ms Deavoll, a copy of which will be presented at the meeting.

Parks and Waterways Area Advocate Warwick Scadden is the officer working with the Sumner Surf Life Saving Club and the artist. The Surf Club is to arrange funding for this project.
