

8. RIVERSIDE PLANTING

The purpose of this report is to request the Board to select two key areas in the Burwood/Pegasus area for a review of riverside planting.

BACKGROUND

At the Parks, Gardens and Waterways Committee meeting of 11 February 2004, deputations were heard on the subject of riparian planting along the banks of the Avon River, in the vicinity of Little Hagley Park and Millbrook Reserve. The Committee heard the concerns and views of the Merivale Precinct Society Inc, The Urban Landscapes Group, Ms Glenda Fox, together with representatives from the Hagley/Ferrymead and Fendalton/Waimairi Community Boards. Written submissions were also acknowledged.

The Committee decided that the following process be followed to review riverside planting in the light of the matters raised:

- Each Community Board be requested to select two key areas in their community for a review of riverside planting.
- The areas selected be assessed by Jenny Moore, independent landscape consultant.
- The criteria for assessment acknowledge the issues raised by the submitters.
- Community Boards be given an opportunity to comment on the respective assessments prior to consideration by the Parks, Gardens and Waterways Committee.
- Appropriate guidelines be prepared for future plantings.

It was also decided that staff develop a long term plan for riverside planting and that Community Boards be involved with the identification of areas within their communities, to be included in the long term plan.

PROPOSAL

With the assistance of the Parks and Waterways Area Advocate, the Board is asked to identify up to two stretches of riparian planting to be assessed against the following criteria:

- Access to the water's edge.
- Safety for pedestrians using the area.
- Preservation of attractive views.
- Appropriate siting of seats.
- Appropriate maintenance practices.
- Density, shading or intrusion upon other significant vegetation.

It is not the intention of this review to look at ecological values, but to follow up on the issues raised at the Parks, Gardens and Waterways Committee.

Staff

- Recommendations:**
1. That the Board, in consultation with the Parks And Waterways Area Advocate, choose two sites of riparian planting in the area, for review.
 2. That the criteria for reviewing the sites be endorsed.
