**PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1. The purpose of this report is to seek funds to cover costs for the Board's participation in the advertising/ raising of community awareness of Heritage Week 2005.

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

2. The theme for Carter Group Heritage Week 2005 (7-14 October 2005 inclusive) is "Restoration – Hands on Heritage".
3. The key objectives of Heritage Week are:
  - (a) To create an annual celebration and so to increase public awareness of the value of the built, social and environmental heritage of Christchurch as a vital component of the unique identity of the City through events, projects and positive publicity.
  - (b) To highlight, celebrate and discuss heritage successes and issues.
4. To provide some low cost advertising of Heritage Week, staff are proposing to refine the display panels for Riccarton, Upper Riccarton, Halswell and Hornby that were produced in 2003. These panels identify local heritage sites, incorporating photographs and some historical information.
5. These panels will be placed at the Sockburn and Riccarton Service Centres, the Halswell and Hornby suburban libraries, and local shopping malls.

**FINANCIAL AND LEGAL CONSIDERATIONS**

6. There are no legal considerations.
7. The cost of the reproduction of the display panels is \$1,500. The proposed source for this funding is the Board's Discretionary Fund, which has a current balance of \$47,682.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS**

It is recommended that the Community Board approve the sum of \$1,500 from its 2005/06 Discretionary Fund to meet the cost of reproducing the display panels on historic issues for Heritage Week 2005.

**4. ORANA PARK WILDLIFE TRUST CORRESPONDENCE**

At the 30 May 2005 meeting of this Committee, there was discussion on correspondence received from the Trust concerning its request for funding support for internal road upgrading and the blue duck breeding and release programme.

At the 9 August 2005 Board meeting, the Board considered information provided by staff which advised that the Trust was being considered for funding from the Council's Metropolitan Funding Sub-Committee.

The Board agreed that:

- (a) the information lie on the table until the outcomes of the Metropolitan Funding Sub-Committee's discussions are known; and
- (b) subsequently, that the request be referred to the Environment Committee for any further consideration.

The Sport and Funding Adviser has now advised that the Metropolitan Funding Sub-Committee has made a grant of \$225,000 to the Orana Park Wildlife Trust for 2005/06, with a similar commitment in 2006/07.

This matter is now referred back to the Committee for further consideration with a view to determining whether any action is required.
