- Kirsten is a second year Canterbury University student studying a Bachelor of Arts degree with a double major in Spanish and mass communications.
- 5. A high achieving individual, Kirsten excelled at Rangi Ruru Secondary School as a leader and participant in gymnastics, drama and academic excellence. She is an accomplished ballet dancer and was awarded highest achievement in Grade 7 RAD honours.
- 6. Kirsten has been competing in Rhythmic Gymnastics for seven years and is a repeated New Zealand national title holder. She has also won a bronze medal at Australian Nationals in 2005 and competed in the Yule Cup Challenge and LA Lights competitions in the USA in 2004 achieving 19th overall.
- 7. Kirsten's goal is to qualify for the 2007 World Gymnastics to be held in Greece in September and this competition will be part of the preparation required to achieve this ambition.
- 8. The team has been working hard to raise funds for this competition with sausage sizzles, selling chocolates, a garage sale and a canteen at a local Rhythmic Gymnastics competition. The gymnasts are well supported by their parents to enable the trip to go ahead. As a University student, Kirsten has limited personal funds to contribute to the costs of this trip and would be most appreciative of Board support.
