The purpose of the seminar is to present the Community Outcomes Baseline Report.

The Council approach to reporting on progress toward the Community Outcomes is primarily through a web-page format (to be presented at the seminar), showing indicator trend results, along with descriptions of community success stories. These web pages are updated frequently as new information becomes available. A summary brochure of key Outcome trends will be provided at the seminar.
