1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

The purpose of this report is to provide a bi-monthly update to the Committee on UDS implementation.

2. IMPLEMENTATION

2.1 Strategic Partners' Forum

SPF met on Monday 13 October at the Convention Centre tand were provided with presentations on the Christchurch City Council's Healthy Environment work programme. There was significant interest from many members in the content of the presentations especially regarding biodiversity and drinking water. The presentations are to be made to UDSIC and Strategic Partner Forum representatives wish to address UDSIC on matters relating to the presentations and the work being undertaken relating to them.

2.3 Central Government

Following the 8 November General Election, National will form the next government with confidence and supply guaranteed by ACT and United Future. This will have an almost immediate effect on the UDS in terms of changes to the RMA. (See separate report.)

2.4 Transport

The New Zealand Transport Agency has appointed Mark Yaxley to be the Regional Director for Canterbury and the West Coast. Mark will be a member of NZTA's Senior Leadership Team and the senior representative of the Agency in Christchurch.

ECan has now signed, on behalf of the Canterbury region, the Memorandum of Understanding giving operational effect to the Crown Funding Package that was announced as part of Budget 2008. The MOU commits the region to continued progress in implementing the UDS and anchoring the land-use pattern in the RPS.
