EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2. The applicant is Asher Richardson, a 16 year Burnside High School student living in Avonhead.
3. Asher has been selected in the New Zealand Under 19 Badminton Team to compete in the World Junior Championships in Malaysia in November this year. The team consists of five males and five females. Asher is the only South Island representative.
4. Asher has been described as a rising star in badminton and is the current New Zealand and Australian Under 17 Singles Champion and is ranked second in the senior division. His coach advises that Asher has the potential to make his mark in the international arena. The World Junior Championships will an opportunity for Asher to compete against world ranked players.
5. Asher plays for the University Club and his goal is to represent New Zealand at the Commonwealth and Olympic Games.

3. The Leadership Programme is delivered by the Papanui Youth Development Trust and is a two day residential programme held at the Trust's Papanui facility. The aim of the programme is to develop leadership skills of young people who in turn share these skills with the community. The course includes effective role modelling, conflict resolution, social skills and team building activities. The participants also prepare and serve a meal to their parents and feed back to them on what are they learning in the programme.
 4. The course participants have been identified as potential leaders by the school. Upon completion of the course, participants will be involved in running leadership activities for other students at Breens and also to local primary schools. In addition to this they will have weekly follow up sessions facilitated by a Breens staff member and will assist in running an in-house leadership programme the following year.
 5. This a new initiative for the school and is not considered part of the school curriculum. The school intends to offer this course each year.

6. The total cost for the course is \$1,600 which covers all workshops, food, student accommodation and transport to activities. The school is requesting \$800 towards this cost and the students will fund the balance.

3. At the recent South Island Secondary Schools Touch Championships the two teams qualified for the National Tournament which is being held in Palmerston North in December this year. For the third consecutive year Papanui High School has had both their Senior Girls and Senior Boys teams qualify.
 4. Players train all year round and play in touch modules during the season as well as in the school team. The school Sports Co-ordinator advises that the applicants are all committed athletes and compete in other sports to an elite level including netball, hockey and athletics. In addition to this the applicants are also role models for other students, taking part in Kapa Haka, Peer Support, and Pacific Island Culture Group and the Head Student Team.
 5. The team has been actively fundraising with regular sausage sizzles, car washing and delivering phone books.
