**PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1. The purpose of this report is to seek the Committee's recommendation to the Board to consider an application for funding from Youth South West Christchurch Trust for \$2,401 to the Riccarton/Wigram Discretionary Response Fund 2010/11.
2. At the time of writing this report, there is \$51,197 remaining in the Fund.

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

3. In 2010/11, the total pool available for allocation for the Riccarton/Wigram Discretionary Response Fund is \$51,197. The Discretionary Response Fund opens each year on 1 July and closes on 30 June the following year, or when all funds are expended.
4. The purpose of the fund is to assist community groups where the project and funding request falls outside other council funding criteria and/or closing dates. This fund is also for emergency funding for unforeseen situations.
5. At the Council meeting of 22 April 2010, the Council resolved to change the criteria and delegations around the local Discretionary Response Fund.
6. The change in criteria limited the items that the local Discretionary Response Fund does not cover to only:
  - (a) Legal challenges or Environment Court challenges against the Council, Council Controlled Organisations or Community Boards decisions;
  - (b) Projects or initiatives that change the scope of a Council project; and
  - (c) Projects or initiatives that will lead to ongoing operational costs to the Council.

The Council also made a note that: "Community Boards can recommend to the Council for consideration grants under (b) and (c)."

7. Information on the application from Youth South West Christchurch Trust is attached (**Attachment 1**). Staff recommend that the Board grant \$2,401 to Youth South West Christchurch Trust for "Big Nite Out" towards venue hire costs.

**PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1. The purpose of this report is to seek the Committee's consideration of an application for funding from the Riccarton/Wigram 2010/11 Youth Development Scheme.

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

2. The applicant is a group, comprising of 14 senior Riccarton High School students that are travelling to Rarotonga in September 2010 for a cultural tour. Of this group, 10 students live within the Riccarton/Wigram Ward. Two students live in the Fendalton/Waimairi Ward. Two students live in the Shirley/Papanui Ward.
3. The tour is open to senior students studying Te Reo Maori on 2010. The tour is from 18-26 September 2010.
4. The purpose of the tour is for students to experience Cook Island Maori culture first hand, and provide an opportunity for them to cement their cultural identity. Te Reo Maori students at Riccarton High School have not had an opportunity to travel and experience Maori culture and language in an environment such as this. All the students have been studying Te Reo Maori for the last three to five years.
5. The students will benefit by having the opportunity to establish and research whakapapa or genealogy links. Many waka (voyaging canoes) stopped in Rarotonga on their migration through the South Pacific to Aotearoa. A large number of these students whakapapa back to these waka, and thus link New Zealand Maori intrinsically to Cook Island Maori people, language and culture. The young people also believe that this trip will develop their confidence to participate in their own culture in the future.
6. The cost of the trip is \$1,260 per person. A number of fund raising events have been planned. Fund raising includes sausage sizzles, trivial pursuit evening, continental caterer's evenings, hangi, kapahaka marathon, as well as the students contributing from their part-time jobs. The parents/whanau of the students are also prepared to assist financially if needed.

### PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to seek the Committee's consideration of an application for funding from the Riccarton/Wigram 2010/11 Youth Development Scheme.

### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2. The applicants, Hoani Arahanga aged 15 years and Aporonia Arahanga, aged 14 years live in Sockburn and attend Christchurch Boys' High School and Christchurch Girls' High School respectively. They are seeking Community Board support to compete in the secondary school age group National Kapa Haka competition in July 2010 in Rotorua.
3. Aporonia and Hoani are both members of Te Pou o Nga Rangi, Kapa Haka team. The team is a secondary school age team, but does not represent any one particular school. Team members come from a range of high schools and the team is made up of approximately 30 boys and girls. The team is not a school based group and is independent of any school. All practices are held outside school hours.
4. The team participated in the secondary school age group regional Kapa Haka competition last year and came second. As a result of coming second, they are now eligible to compete at the National Kapahaka Competition from 27 to 30 July 2010.
5. Hoani has been participating in Kapa Haka for 10 years and he also tutors in the art of the Taiaha. He has attained Junior Tutor rank at Taiha wananga, plays volleyball for Canterbury (2010) and toured South America in 2009 playing rugby. His future goals are in sports and education. Hoani believes that participating in this event will enable him to be a good role model for other teenagers of the same age and that he will also be a good ambassador for the community at a national level.
6. Aporonia has been doing Kapa Haka all her life. She has been with Te Pou o Nga Rangi team for nearly two and a half years. She is a high grade musician and plays the saxophone, the guitar, and also sings. Her future goals are to be a musician and a teacher.

### PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to seek the Committee's consideration for an application for funding from the Riccarton/Wigram 2010/11 Youth Development Scheme.

### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2. The applicant, Jacob Benjamin Lim, is a 19 year old who lives in Upper Riccarton and is seeking Community Board support to compete for New Zealand at the World Triathlon Age Group Championships in Hungary. This trip will take place from 7 to 15 September 2010.
3. Jacob is a talented sportsman having been a competitive age group swimmer for most of his sporting life, where he was consistently ranked in the top five in Canterbury. He switched to Triathlon only two years ago and has been competing for one year at the national level.
4. Jacob is currently training daily leading up to the World Championships, doing about 12 sessions a week. Although Jacob has only been involved in this sport for two years, his achievements include a tenth place at the National Triathlon Championships in Wellington and has gained four top ten places in national age group races across New Zealand. Jacob's goal is to be ranked in the top three by the end of this year and the experience of competing on the international stage can help him achieve this goal.
5. Jacob is raising funds through various means for his trip, including part time work, sponsorships and selling paintings and has raised about \$400 to date. Any financial assistance would be greatly appreciated.

### PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to seek the Committee's consideration for an application for funding from the Riccarton/Wigram 2010/11 Youth Development Scheme.

### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2. The applicant, Nathan James Flannery, is a 17 year old Aidenfield resident who is seeking Community Board support to travel to the Czech Republic to compete at the World Junior Rowing Championships. This trip will take place from 21 July – 12 August 2010.
3. Nathan has been involved in rowing for four years and is the first rower from St Thomas of Canterbury College to achieve national representative status. Nationally, Nathan has achieved very well in his sport. At the 2010 South Island Championships alone, he won gold in the Men's Club Four and Men's Open Quad, silver in Men's Club Double and Bronze in the Men's Club Single. At the South Island Secondary Schools he gained a first, two second placings and one third placing. At the NZ Secondary Schools Maadi Cup, Nathan won gold in the U18 Quad and Bronze in the U18 Double.
4. As well as rowing, Nathan has been involved with various other sports such as volleyball, cricket, basketball, cross country, athletics and cycling. Nathan currently trains three to five times a week and leading up to events such as the Maadi Cup, training frequency can increase to 12 times a week. For Nathan, training for the World Junior Rowing Championships begins with a two month camp at Lake Karapiro, and from here he will depart for the Czech Republic.
5. Nathan's future goals include winning a gold medal at this year's Junior World Championships and to ultimately represent New Zealand at the Olympics and win a gold medal. Nathan has indicated that this competition will provide him with valuable knowledge of the mental and physical commitment required to compete at the highest level.
6. To date Nathan has raised approximately \$1,400 for his trip and Rowing New Zealand is contributing \$1,177 to the expenses. Nathan would appreciate any financial assistance from the Community Board.

2. The Philippine Culture and Sports Society have ten athletes that reside in the Riccarton/Wigram ward who are travelling to Auckland to compete in the National Labour Weekend Filipino Volleyball tournament. This tournament is being held from 22 – 25 October 2010.

4. The Philippine Culture and Sports co-ordinate a local basketball and volleyball sports programme that involves weekly training sessions and competitive and social games. The programme also incorporates other sports such as tennis, table tennis and badminton and is predominantly run by volunteers from the society. This programme not only encourages new migrants to be active and socialise, but is developing links with Canterbury sporting bodies for some of their players.
5. The Philippine Culture and Sports Society is a long standing member of the Federation of Filipino Associations, Societies and Clubs in NZ and players from their local competition have been selected to represent Christchurch at the Auckland tournament. The tournament is an opportunity for players to further develop their skills in a more competitive environment. These skills will improve the quality of their play in various competitions they are involved in, whether it be school based or for Canterbury.
6. At the tournament in 2009, the women's volleyball team was placed second and the boys' basketball team placed third. This year they are taking nine teams in total to the tournament who are competing in volleyball, basketball, badminton and tennis.
7. The work of the Philippine Culture and Sports continues to grow in Christchurch and in September 2009, the annual 'Global Basketball' competition was held at Cowles and Pioneer Stadiums. The tournament is due to be staged again in September 2010. Teams from various ethnic groups have been invited to compete in a formal competition over a two day period. The Philippine Culture and Sports Society came up with the initial concept for this competition four years ago, which is now being supported by the Christchurch City Council Recreation and Sports Unit and co-ordinated in conjunction with Canterbury Basketball Association 'Junior Advisory Group'.
8. The team has currently fundraised \$2,200 through ticket sales from a cultural dance event they organised, selling chocolates, donations and will continue to fundraise until they go away.
