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PURPOSE OF REPORT

 The purpose of this report is for the Hagley/Ferrymead Community Board to consider applications for funding from its 2011/12 Discretionary Response Fund from the Sumner Urban Design group for \$15,000 for payment of salaries and wages for time spent in the development of the Sumner master plan.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2. In 2011/12, the total pool available for allocation for the Hagley/Ferrymead Discretionary Response Fund is \$51,197. By resolution of the Council unspent or unallocated funds from the 2010/11 Strengthening Communities Fund and the Metropolitan Small Grants Fund were allocated to local discretionary response funds, increasing the amount available for allocation by the Hagley/Ferrymead Community Board in 2011/12 to \$73,084.40. The Discretionary Response Fund opens each year on 1 July and closes on 30 June the following year, or when all funds are expended.
- 3. The purpose of the Fund is to assist community groups where the project and funding request falls outside other council funding criteria and/or closing dates. This fund is also for emergency funding for unforeseen situations.
- 4. At the Council meeting of 22 April 2010, Council resolved to change the criteria and delegations around the local Discretionary Response Fund.
- 5. The change in criteria limited the items that the local Discretionary Response Fund does not cover to only:
 - (a) Legal challenges or Environment Court challenges against the Council, Council Controlled Organisations or Community Board decisions
 - (b) Projects or initiatives that change the scope of a Council project, and
 - (c) Projects or initiatives that will lead to ongoing operational costs to the Council.

Council also made a note that: "Community Boards can recommend to the Council for consideration grants under (b) and (c)."

- 6. Based on these criteria, the application from the Sumner Urban Design Group for \$15,000 for payment of salaries and wages for time spent in the development of the Sumner master plan is eligible.
- 7. Detailed information on the applications and staff comments are included in the **attached** Decision Matrix.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

8. There is currently \$59,828 remaining in the Board's 2011/12 Discretionary Response Fund.
