


1. DEPUTATIONS BY APPOINTMENT

1.1 SOUTH NEW BRIGHTON COMMUNITY TOY LIBRARY



Kristin Simmons and Belinda Barrett-Walker, from the South New Brighton Community Toy Library, were in attendance to seek assistance in finding suitable accommodation for the Toy Library. Kristin Simmons explained that the toy library had been running for about 15 years and catered for children from birth through to about seven years old. The toy library currently operated out of the supper room at the South New Brighton Community Centre. Due to the size of the room it limited membership numbers reaching their potential. Operating hours could be extended. The toy library wished to locate to a permanent location where they had sole use.

The Board **decided** that the Community Development Adviser be requested to report on land and accommodation options for the South New Brighton Community Toy Library.

1.2 KEEP CHRISTCHURCH BEAUTIFUL LITTER COUNTS

Tom Baker, from Keep Christchurch Beautiful, was in attendance concerning the latest litter counts in the Burwood/Pegasus area. Tom Baker noted that there were 86 sites citywide that were survey sites for litter problems. The general trend of the survey highlighted increased litter in suburbs. Four of the 'top 10' litter sites were in the Burwood/Pegasus area.

The Board **decided** to request a report on a possible joint project with Keep Christchurch Beautiful to target the major litter sites of concern. Board members indicated matters of concern that could be investigated further by officers.
