3. LOCAL RESIDENTS' ASSOCIATION



Sally Unwin of the South New Brighton Residents' Association updated the Board on current activities and issues.

Ms Unwin extended the Association's thanks to Don Rowlands for his input and support as the Board's liaison representative.

She expressed the Association's keenness and desire to see the completion of the 'Welcome to South New Brighton' sign and referred to the continued hard work being put in regarding the ocean outfall project. The Board's endorsement was sought in respect of the three extra testing sites at the South New Brighton Life Saving Club, Caspian Street and Bridge Street.

Other areas of interest to the Association included the development of a local heritage trail, addressing the magpie nuisance in the area and an ongoing desire to have improvements made for pedestrians especially school children, using the Bridge Street/Estuary Road intersection at the roundabout.

Ms Unwin confirmed that any funding contribution from the Association towards the 'Welcome to South New Brighton' sign was unlikely given the volunteer nature of the group with its limited resources.
