I wish to speak about the main points in my submission at the hearings from 1-11 June.

- ① I strongly support the development of the area north of the city which includes the Lake Isaac proposal. Future generations will be grateful for a green area equivalent to the Port Hills reserves with the likes of cycle tracks, running tracks, rowing facilities etc. It is important that the city recognizes bird numbers will need to be controlled by humane methods - mallards are a problem in many areas.
- ② I would like to see increased planting of 'chch natives - Kahikatea etc to provide food for native birds and to increase the biodiversity of our city.
- ③ Positive 'push' to encourage alternative pets to cats because of effect on bird life.
- ④ Very concerned about danger for cyclists on New Brighton expressway having to cross Marshlands road onto QEII Drive (Marehau School Pupils risk their lives trying to cross; need underpass)
- ⑤ Well done with the cycleways/walking paths along rail lines in Paparua area. Looking forward to Cassmore St/Auckland St cycleway (No 167)
