It is with great pleasure that we see the CCC has plans to upgrade Carrick St. Over the past 2 years our street has continued to be neglected while those all around have been upgraded. Thornton St has been upgraded to the extent that traffic flow has been increased in Carrick from traffic cutting between Flockton and Aylesford. Recently we discovered that work will begin in Spreight St which ~~is~~ will ^{make the street} ~~become~~ a dead-end, further increasing the traffic flow for us. With many small children living in Carrick St now, it is imperative that the Council give very serious thought to the traffic flow and safety of our street.
