I wish to speak about the main points in my submission at the hearings from 1-11 June.

Notes re talk with Mrs Steenhart. 108 Cavendish Rd. Chch 5. 352-8925

Mrs Steenhart advised that the silver birch trees which have been put in by Council some time ago, (?3 years) along Royleen Street have now grown up through the power lines. The result is that the roots have cracked open parts of the footpath because the roots are shallow. Need to be dealt with urgently. Also creating a hazard with people walking on this footpath.

Our neighbour also advises that the crown of the road is high, is the narrowest part and is outside 108 Cavendish Road. Heavy containers, high loads and laden trucks are constantly breaking up the road creating pot holes. No sooner are the holes fixed that they reappear. The traffic is heavier than it ever was and even buses are finding it hard to get around the narrow part outside No. 108.
