2 The Pioneer Pool needs a dedicated team to swim with no lessons held in the lane pool. Pioneer was commissioned for the community on the basis that it would not have a swimming club or take school lessons. These conditions have been badly stretched making it all but impossible for the lane pool to provide opportunity for adult swimmers - the expected closure of school pools in the
