Your Submission:	<p>Do you have any comments on the major projects in our Draft Community Plan?</p> <p>P.14 Tree renewal project and Avon River upgrade. We strongly support tree renewal as an essential project with planned expenditure of \$17.2 million.</p> <p>We encourage the CCC to use more native species when planting or renewing trees in our parks, along roadsides or riparian areas.</p> <p>We also support the Botanic Gardens Project; costing \$10.8 million</p> <p>City Development P.9</p> <p>We strongly support all Council moves to provide information, advice and funding for city heritage and its conservation.</p> <p>Do you have any comments on groups of activities (The activities and services the Council provides?)</p> <p>Regulatory Services P.17</p> <p>We believe that the preservation of the catchment areas of the city aquifers should be given the highest priority whenever new consents for housing or industrial development are being processed.</p> <p>We wish to see the Council following the National Guidelines for Clean Air and taking measures to reduce harmful emissions in the City. The Council should actively encourage the reduction of energy use especially through the burning of fossil fuels. It should encourage greater use of renewable energy sources such as solar, wood and wind. We look to the CCC to lead the way in its new Council office building.</p> <p>We consider the Council could do more to encourage the use of double glazing, solar heating, rainwater collection tanks for watering gardens and energy conservation.</p>
