Do you have any comments on the major projects in our Draft Community Plan?

Re Stormwater and waterways. Would it be prudent to place charcoal or similar filters between stormwater pipes and the natural waterways to be regularly replaced and appropriately cleaned? (No need to be present for a hearing on this matter)

Do you have any comments on groups of activities (The activities and services the Council provides?)

Do you have any other comments or suggestions you want to make?

Relating to High Voltage Transmission Lines, HVTL, Cell sites, TV and Radio Transmitters across the LTCCP in areas of health, planning, technology etc. I would like to see the 20 meter setback from HVTL enforced and expanded where the transmissions exceed 66 KV. This is very important in line with the proposed network upgrades.

With the unbundling of the Telecom network there may be greater proliferation of wireless transmitters within the city, so I would like to see a policy put in place to deal with this possibility that includes the desire to co-site rather than individual sites. The use of wire/cable links instead of microwave links. The adoption of the McIntyre case standard or at least Dr Blacks recommendation that transmitters be placed no closer than 50 metres from houses. A comprehensive study of the health and wellbeing of occupants of houses surrounding existing transmitters. That FM be placed on hilltops as is predominantly nationwide (over 90%) and worldwide. That AM transmitters be placed in remote areas where they were originally like Gebbies Pass, or at least 1.5 km from houses and schools, an example of close proximity to houses and school is Phillipotts Rd, or at least a proper health study is done in the vicinity. I would also like to see a full health study as recommended in the council's Sweet report, of the health and wellbeing of the residents surrounding the Ouruhia Transmitter.
