## Questions

1 Do you have any comments on the major projects in our draft Our Community Plan? page number 134

- We are not happy that Jellie Park is getting even more spent on it when we haven't got a pool in the Linwood/Woolston area.
- We feel that Jellie Park Pool may be closer to many people in the North area than QE II is for people in Linwood + Woolston
- We think the Linwood/Woolston area is justified in having a pool - just as much as Papuni area and that we shouldn't have to wait 12-14 years for one in the East. There are a lot of young people in the East area who need a local pool facility as travelling too far is not practical (2 buses, no car, too expensive, too difficult, QE II unsuitable).

2 Do you have any comments on groups of activities (the activities and services that Council provides)? page number 98

- We value the community centre as it is within walking distance of our homes, it is a safe and welcoming place, we can meet people, our children can socialize with other children and play with good quality toys, it is affordable (gold coin donation) and there is a community worker to organise the groups.
- We want the CCC to keep local community meeting places open as they are important. A bigger facility further away would not be the same (not personal enough) and we would not go to it - too far, too expensive.
- Keep the libraries such as Spreyden open (104) • Keep Woolston Pool open til new pool ready.

3 Do you have any other comments or suggestions you want to make? page number 134

- That a new pool/aquafacility be built in the Linwood/Woolston area as described in the draft Aquatic Facilities Plan but within 10 years time (perhaps upgrade to Jellie Park could be delayed)
- The Linwood/Woolston area has a large number of young families on low incomes who cannot afford to get to QE II pool
- QE II pool does not meet their needs
  - slides too expensive, wave pool not suitable for preschoolers
- Parents want a simple couple of pools
  - a shallow one for preschoolers and a deeper larger one. Some want outdoor pools, some want indoor ones.
