  - We would like a pool in Linwood. QEII is too far to take kids. & too expensive

- We want community centres like ours kept. They are important to many local people who ~~can't afford~~ can't afford to travel too far.
  - It is important to have a close place to come to as some of us don't drive cars and want to socialize with people who live near us.
  - We would like the community workers to stay in the centres to support the local people as some people need their help (our group probably wouldn't happen if there wasn't a community worker)

- Keep the libraries such as Belfast & Spreydon open as these are very important to local people, especially families with children and elderly people who should not have to catch two buses for these services
