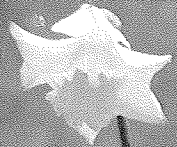

We are concerned about the comment in the draft plan that Community Halls should reduce by 20%.

Our Community Hall, Meeting Rooms and Pottery and Squash facilities are owned by Mt. Pleasant residents and situated on reclaimed land leased from Council.

The facilities are extensively used (see schedule attached) and provide activities which encourage healthy lifestyles, learning opportunities, and recreational opportunities.

Cost to council is up to \$5,000 p.a. in the form of a grant for maintenance costs incurred.
