recreation) programme for primary school aged children based in Waltham but serving the Waltham, Sydenham and Opawa communities. We strongly believe that funding to the community sector should be maintained at it's current level as this is the bare minimum that allows our group to remain financially viable. We are aware that our position is shared by other OSCAR programmes.

Although we now receive monies from MSD (Ministry of Social Development) this does not allow us to provide quality care and recreation opportunities to some children in our community who fall outside the "user pays" ethos of the level-playing field economy. Whereas the money we have received from the Christchurch City Council has allowed us to run for many years, an extremely successful sponsorship scheme targetting "at risk" children.

This has contributed to a safer, stronger healthier community where children are encouraged to feel a sense of belonging and responsibility.

We would also like to oppose the withdrawal of the mobile library bus as this is a service regularly used by our programme. We have also encouraged children attending WOOSH to join the library and use it each week. If this service goes we know some of those children will not have the opportunity to visit other libraries.
