I strongly support and advocate for the continued active involvement of CCC in supporting the most marginalised and disadvantaged in our communities and agree with the inclusion of community grants in the plan</p> <p>2. The CCC's objectives in the plan (page 98) do not reflect the spirit of CCC's own "Statement of Intent Regarding the Council's Relationship with the Community and Voluntary Sectors", which talks about "robust relationships, respect and trust, sustainable development" rather than "providing advice, training and support"</p> <p>3. The Plan (page 101) refers to c\$4.5m under community grants. My understanding is that there is some \$8.2m available, some of which is coded elsewhere in the financial accounts. My suggestion is that the full amount is explicitly placed together, to safeguard community grants against gradual erosion.</p> <p>4. With current government priorities, local councils are likely to play an increasingly pivotal role in supporting communities. CCC needs to continue to embrace a leadership role, and work for the long-term in a partnership & community development way.</p> <p>5. As a rate payer, I am happy with the proposed rate increases in order for CCC to continue its vital funding role with the community and voluntary sector</p> |
