<b>Your Submission:</b>	<b>Do you have any comments on the major projects in our Draft Community Plan?</b>
	None of the leisure centres proposed are necessary. Spend the funding set aside for them on the maintenance and upgrade of existing facilities. Library and community centre closures will produce undesirable outcomes, reduce ability of those areas to participate in community. Christchurch city will be the long term loser.
	<b>Do you have any comments on groups of activities (The activities and services the Council provides?)</b>
	Public toilets in Cathedral Square (p.209) are less than acceptable in all categories - new units with greater night time security need to be added, and/or open hours of main toilet facilities lengthened.  Waste minimisation strongly encouraged, especially at supermarkets. Shopping bag usage quite excessive. Recycling, renumbering the triangles to broaden recycling range to be encouraged with reduction of ecological footprint in mind. Kate Valley landfill estimated fill up time is completely unacceptable - landfills NOT a long term solution. Reduction, recycling and conversion of green clippings to biofuel all possible alternatives.  Kerbing on Aorangi Road - Condell Ave-Wairakei Road needs replacing. Should this happen, road should not be narrowed excessively.
	<b>Do you have any other comments or suggestions you want to make?</b>
	Comments below relate to financial strategy:  The financial overview plan for reduction of costs (p. 86), wrongfully proposes to shut libraries which help to form the hearts of these communities in socio-economic circumstances not as good as for example Fendalton. Libraries such as those in Bishopdale are also useful for the elderly who would otherwise have to go to places like Papanui, which may be beyond their means.

**Your Submission  
(Cont'd):**

Sockburn pool (p. 86) should not be closed - it means more pressure on Jellie Park, Wharenui and other pools in western and southern Christchurch. Use the money saved from not going ahead with new "leisure centres" to fund necessary upgrades at Sockburn and elsewhere.

With view to national security, different operational ethics and community responsibility, selling Lyttelton Port Company is undesirable. Foreign owners possibly out to make a quick dollar, and not necessarily interested in Lyttelton or Christchurch's longterm wellbeing.
