	LIBRARY CLOSURES I am against all library closures in Christchurch.
	Last year we moved house to one where we hope to spend the next twenty years - well into old age. One criteria when looking at where to live was that it would be walking distance to a library. Bishopdale with its library suited us well. We were not looking for a state of the art modern library with cafes etc. the proximity to where we live was the most important thing and as we get older this will become even more important:
	Fuel shortages and oil price hikes combined with a lower income and less mobility as we get older make having a library nearby extremely important.
