	CLOSURE OF LIBRARIES Closing suburban libraries is an extroaadinarily short-sighted attempt to cut costs. Over the last year Christchurch has come under some heavy criticism - violence has risen, under-age prostitution has added to a "sleaze city" reputation, the overseeing of some of our cultural facilities has been widely queried. One fact has not had as much prominence in the media - Christchurch has a relatively low rate of qualified school leavers. Surely this explains much of the above. The presence of a local library from age 1 to 100 is vital in bringing learning and the enjoyment of learning into the day to day lives of a city's citizens. For young mothers, for the elderly with mobility difficulties, for those without private transport, the library offers a place to go and look and read and learn. It also acts as a community centre - without a local library many areas are left with the ubiquitous mall with its relentless, culturally void commercial pressure as its only community focus. Libraries are a vital antidote to boredom, despair, ignorance and loneliness. They fall outside of profit-making ventures but they are inspirational and indicative of a city's real priorities.
