It will help us if your submission also refers to the page of either the full version or the summary version.

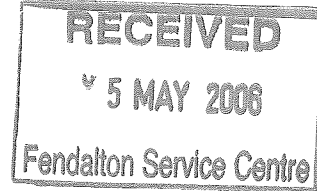

I hope Councillors will address Christchurch's SMOG Problem as in the past Councils have contributed to Smog and Pollution when burning coal in their Tuam St. Offices and Elsewhere. Some Councillors have not always encouraged citizens to choose Alternative Methods of Heating, nor been a good example. We need Ecan as a "Watchdog" for Standards for Industry, Commercial, business, households and Council, so we can reach the target of cleaning up the air in Christchurch by 2013.
