1 Do you have any comments on the major projects in our draft Community Plan? page number **73**

The Botanic Gardens proposal involves a funding of \$11.1m. Whilst these improvements are undoubtedly required with a growing clientele, I would urge the Council to fix the drainage problem relating to the main path i.e. the Museum to the Restaurant. I have personally seen still water to a depth of 3" and 1 metre wide on the edges of the major thoroughfare ^{long} after rain. Not good in the eyes of our overseas visitors.

2 Do you have any comments on groups of activities (the activities and services that Council provides)? page number **3 and 86**.

Proposals to rationalise three community libraries (page 86) is a complete reversal of goals & objectives as outlined on page 49. The savings of \$450,000 represents 1/8 of one percent of the total expenditure proposed for 2006/7. It is so small, that in respect to the proposed outcomes, it comes within the scope of the cautionary note outlined on page 3. The council must remove this proposal from the final plan, as it is completely contrary to other outcomes wished by the Council, and it is part of the strategic asset outlined in page 294 (Library network)

3 Do you have any other comments or suggestions you want to make? page number **153 & 144**

153. Streets & Transport. — Street cleanliness.
The draft annual plan 2006 page 75 indicates that urban ditch channel be cleaned at few weekly interval.
