That the city Mall development is paid for by a targeted rate. Not just proposed but definite. From my experience of the New Brighton mall re developemt, the targeted rate was dropped and the rate payers now have to cover this.

The businesses have to survive in this environment, and if they are not willing to cover the costs they can move.

The provision of good, safe cycle ways is vey important. With increased oil prices more people will not be able to afford to use cars daily. People are presently appehensive about biking as it is unsafe and the roads are littered with broken glass, potholes and no curbs in some areas.

Why trim small amounts off the budget by closing libraries, etc when the biggest item still remains the Streets and Transport budget (\$140-180m pa), which contains some large-cost road capacity projects of dubious long-term value. Try to really think about the effects that you are creating. Cutting a piece through Blenheim Rd for one is a waste of money.

Less to be spent on just cosmetics, ie, resealing roads unnecessarily.
