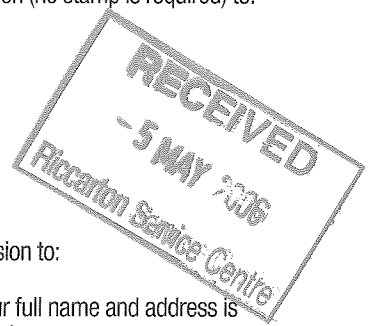

① Do you have any comments on the major projects in our draft Our Community Plan? page number 4 in Summary

Of the essential projects, need to reduce the funds to be spent on the new bus exchange, fit out for new civic offices, civil defence building, and tree renewal (many trees can be retained). Discretionary projects should have been in priority order, with new leisure centres, Botanic Gardens, and City Mall of lower importance.

② Do you have any comments on groups of activities (the activities and services that Council provides)? page number 86-48 in Summary

The three libraries must NOT be closed. Retain the mobile library, but improve knowledge of it and increase use. Not enough post offices for council payments, most too busy already. Encourage payment by direct debiting.

The Service Centres at Riccarton and Hornby must NOT be closed.

All swimming pools should be retained. Savings from closing libraries and pools are minimal.

③ Do you have any other comments or suggestions you want to make? page number 91

"Maintaining the attractiveness of the city."

Increasing or improving would be better terms. Underground wiring would do much to improve city appearance. Undergrounding is only discretionary and not in plan.

Orion should spend more of its profit on undergrounding, and the Orion \$70 million invested, should also be used for this.
