	My comments refer to the development of Lake Isaac.
	I believe there was funding allocated previously to this project, but was undelivered. I believe bird strike and the airport proximity were the reasons.
	The site has been moved and is now 4km away. Both Auckland and Wellington airports are surrounded by waterways, and for both bird strike is highly manageable. Most airports in the world have waterways very near LAX etc.
