① Do you have any comments on the major projects in our draft Our Community Plan? page number 4+6

Overspending: \$59.5 million Bus Exchange, too expensive, \$4.3 mil. for new Civic offices, far too expensive, \$3.6 mil. Civil Defence building - Why replicate? \$17.2 mil. for Tree renewal, Trees lost in St Martins area, Heathcote River - lost in 1993 storm, never replaced, excuse "no money" \$37.6 mil. for Strategic land purchases. The streets, rivers etc are a mess! Why do you wish to purchase more land when you can't even upkeep what we've got? Using Post Offices for Council payments.
