Submission re Draft Community Plan 2006. 25/12/06

I submit that the Council must not make any rates increase to exceed the C.P.I. rate of inflation (3.16% including GST)

My husband and I receive National Superannuation and our youngest daughter and her daughter share this house. Our daughter is on an Invalid Benefit - she and my husband have bad arthritis. We believe that Bishopdale & Redwood libraries should be kept open. We agree with the proposed spending on school safety zones.

To save money we propose

Cancel the botanical gardens information centre & new leisure centres. The city does not need the information centre and cannot afford it. Any further leisure centres should be left to private enterprise to own. We question your proposed increase in regional parks - Surely the city has plenty already.

The following should be deferred until affordable without increasing rates -

- ① New Bus Exchange, ② fit out for Civic offices, ③ tree renewal,
- ④ revitalisation of botanical gardens

You tell us that the Council is being asked for improved roading

yet you continue to waste money on narrowing streets & corners eg, Grant Rd, May St, Procter St, Frank St ~~St~~ & many others.
