We support the proposals to upgrade Cowles Stadium.

Korfball is the world's only mixed team sport. We have been active in Christchurch since 1997, since which time we have been fortunate to take advantage of a number of services provided by the Christchurch City Council. More information is available at www.korfball.org.nz.

Korfball Canterbury (and previously, Korfball New Zealand) has been a regular user of Cowles Stadium since 1999. Our capacity to provide our sport to Christchurch people is largely dependent on our ability to access quality indoor court space. Cowles Stadium has been the venue best able to meet our needs, and is an excellent venue for us. Enlarging the floor space by approximatley 50 per cent would give us the opportunity to expand the numbers playing korfball in our regular local winter competition by an equivalent amount.

Increasing the total floor area, as proposed, would also give us the opportunity to set up the stadium with a full size korfball court (20m x 40m), which at present is only possible at Pioneer and QE2 in Christchurch.

This is an excellent initiative for Christchurch, particularly the eastern suburbs. We would welcome the opportunity to provide more information on how an upgraded and enlarged Cowles Stadium would benefit the sport of korfball in Canterbury.
