SUBMISSION TO COMMUNITY PLAN

Wastewater

1. Promotion and upgrading of organic toilets.
2. Waste treatment plant in Little River for the protection of Lake Wairewa.
3. Dairy farming should not receive the support it gets. A lot of water is wasted producing milk, which is not as indispensable to consumers as the industry likes us to believe.

Recreation

1. More walkways in Banks Peninsula, exploring access through private land.

Parks, open spaces and waterways.

1. Promotion of native corridors in BP. At present there are huge gaps between bushy areas.
2. Assistance to clean up Lake Wairewa and education of land holders re farming practices.
3. Promotion of Restoration plantings in BP.

Transport

1. Regular bus service to Akaroa from Christchurch and back again.
2. Promotion of carpooling in BP.
3. Cycleways in CHCH away from main traffic, so cyclists are not as exposed to car fumes.

Refuse minimisation

1. Efficient collection of recyclables. BP needs the equipment to process and bail glass, plastics, and tin, to keep transport costs at a minimum.
2. Urge the government to introduce a waste legislation with teeth to it. The packaging accord is not working. Composite packaging should be abolished.

Plastic bags replaced by durable bags.

4. Transparent plastic bags, so it is clear what is inside. (*rubbish bags*)
 5. Symbols on containers should be made much larger and readable.
 6. Customers should be made to pay for each bag that goes to landfill.
 7. Contractors should receive a bonus if they reduce rubbish bags to landfill.
- Landfill has to become a very dirty word.
