Heritage Protection:

There is no doubt that there is a growing awareness of heritage issues in Christchurch, as evidenced by the Council's own survey, shown on Pg 6 of the Draft Annual Plan.

Consequently, the Christchurch Civic Trust requests that the sum available for the purchase of at risk heritage buildings and places be increased to \$2.5 million.
