The purpose of this report is to seek the Board's approval of two new right of way names.

1/15 WYCHBURY STREET

Three names (George Edward, Stoical and Barrett Lanes) were proposed for this right of way at the 7 April 1998 Board Meeting, and all three were declined. The history of the property has been researched in an endeavour to find a name, however, no suitable name was found, the longstanding owner's name being 'Cox' which is already in use in Christchurch. The names TULIP, BLUEBELL, FANTAIL and CHAFFINCH are put forward for the Board to choose from.

2/19A HAMMOND PLACE

The name Swinford Lane was placed before the Board for consideration at the 18 June 1998 meeting, and was declined by the Board. The applicant has requested the Board give further consideration to the name Swinford, and has supplied more information on the historical significance of the name. Swinford Farm is situated in North Canterbury near Hawarden, and is part of the Horsley Downs Station. (The historic Horsley Downs Church is about 5km north of Hawarden)
