**5.1 75TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS - FOREST AND BIRD SOCIETY**

The following letter has been received from Valerie Campbell, Royal Forest and Bird Protection Society of New Zealand Inc, thanking the Christchurch City Council for its support of their 75th Anniversary celebrations:

*"Our Branch wishes to thank the Christchurch City Council for their support of our 75th Anniversary celebrations at Travis Swamp on 28 March 1998.*

*A large group of members and environmental organisations were present for the planting of 75 Kahikatea seedlings, and a great many other plants. I think all present agree on the value of the Travis Wetland as an invaluable habitat and a rare reminder of past environments in this area."*

**5.2 PHOTOS OF THE CHRISTCHURCH PIER**

The following letter has been received from Peter Seymour, regarding protecting photos of the Pier for the future:

*"You will be aware that I have been involved in the development of the Christchurch Pier since the beginning and have been the official photographer for this project.*

*I have around 500 photos from start to finish including the Opening Day celebrations; these will be the only complete historical record of the building of the Pier. All of these photos have been produced and paid for by myself. Many of these photos have been reproduced in magazines, publications and news release items throughout the building period, I have not been recompensed for any of this throughout the entire period.*

*It is now time to protect them for the future, and it seems the best way is to transfer to CD Rom data collection, these can then be accessed by students etc through the new library computer systems and provide a permanent archival record of the building of the pier for future generations.*

*I have checked with Copyland who seem to be very expensive and will only produce from negatives which will require Photoshop to access, another expensive software item. Pegasus Photographics in New Brighton can provide CDs scanned from prints which can be accessed through inexpensive Kodak photo software, or even the Image programme on Windows 95.*

*I am seeking funding through the Community Board to reproduce the photos taken by myself onto a CD system to enable easy access and provide a permanent historical record of this important event in the history of New Brighton.*

*I am seeking a grant of \$2,000 to cover the cost of the quoted price of \$1,687.50 plus caption expenses to enable this project to proceed.”*

**Chairman’s**

**Recommendation:** That Mr Seymour be commended for his initiative, but due to a lack of Board funds, his request be referred to Mainstreet for funding from its \$40,000 Board allocation.
