The purpose of this report is to seek the approval by the Board of five new road names.

WAI/98/622 Becmead Investments Limited 519 Harewood Road-Waimairi Ward

This subdivision is the first of two adjacent subdivisions that will share a new entry off Harewood Road, and both roading patterns will be a mirror image of each other.

The names submitted are **Nunweek Boulevard** for the main entry to the subdivision off Harewood Road (The subdivision adjoins Nunweek Park, and the property has been known as the Nunweek Block for many years).

Becmead Drive for the main spine road (Becmead is the name of the company that has owned and farmed the land for forty seven years).

Napoleon Close for the cul de sac serving Lots 84 – 92 (Napoleon was the name of the stud bull for the jersey herd run on the property from 1952 till about 1963.).

Rawei Close for the cul de sac serving Lots 73 – 80 (Rawei Harold Hill was the founder of Becmead Investments, and is the father and grandfather of the present shareholders).

Le Roi’s Way or **Le Roi Way** for the road linking the subdivision with Trafford Street (Alfred Victor Le Roi was the landowner prior to Becmead Investments ownership) Le Roi Way is favoured over Le Roi’s Way, as apostrophes are not used on street nameplates.

Recommendation: That the following names be approved for use by the Board: “Nunweek Boulevard”, “Becmead Drive”, “Napoleon Close”, “Rawei Close” and “Le Roi Way”.

Chairman’s Recommendation: That the foregoing recommendation be adopted.
