## 2. DEPUTATIONS BY APPOINTMENT:

### 2.1 LANDSDOWNE COMMUNITY CENTRE

Greg Burgess, Chairman of the Landsdowne Community Centre Management Committee, will outline the current financial position of the Community Centre and its request for $\$ 2,000$ from Board Project funds towards cleaning costs.

The Board resolved at its 7 April 1998 meeting to allocate $\$ 2,000$ from its 1998/99 Discretionary funds towards the cost of cleaners wages at Landsdowne Community Centre, and to consider this item for its 1999/2000 funds.

### 2.2 CHRISTCHURCH POLYTECH RECREATION DEPARTMENT

Mr Gareth Wheeler, from the Christchurch Polytech Recreation Department would like to make application to the Community Board's 1999/2000 project funds for funding transport for local schools to attend recreation activities. Mr Wheeler advises that second year diploma studies students will soon be starting their Recreation Leadership module.

The Leadership module involves the Polytech students setting up and running recreation activities for school children. The Polytech has funds to pay for the activities, (eg Rock wall at the YMCA) but doesn't have the funds to pay for the transportation. Mr Wheeler would like to base this ongoing module in the Spreydon-Heathcote area and aim at the decile one and two schools.
2.3 ROWLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL

Graeme Farrant, Acting Principal of Rowley Primary School, would like to speak in support of the Christchurch Polytech Recreation Department running their Recreation Leadership module in conjunction with Rowley School. Mr Farrant would also like the opportunity to thank the Board for their support in providing Rowley School with a transport fund.

## KINGDOM RESOURCES LTD

Barbara Arnold and John Exton, Managers of Kingdom Resources Ltd, will address their Project Fund request of $\$ 14,000$ from the Community Board's 1999/2000 Project funds. Forty percent of Kingdom Resources clients come from Spreydon-Heathcote and the above figure equates to $40 \%$ of the total funding request of $\$ 35,000$. Approaches to other Community Boards have been made with limited success.
