The purpose of this report is to seek Board approval to formalise the "Give Way" sign and road markings in Queensbury Street at its intersection with New Brighton Road.

In response to concerns raised about traffic safety at the local shopping precinct on New Brighton Road, between Fleete Street and Queensbury Street, a proposal was developed to recess parking on the north side and install a pedestrian refuge island (*see attached plan, page 33*). A leaflet explaining the proposed work was distributed to residents in April 1999, and it was generally accepted. However, the proposed length of "No Stopping" lines outside the dairy at 144 New Brighton Road has been reduced due to concerns expressed by the owner at the loss of parking spaces adjacent to his business. This work is expected to be completed by the end of September 1999.

It is now appropriate to approve the installation of the "Give Way" sign and road markings.

- **Recommendations:** 1. That the Board approve the installation of a "Give Way" sign against Queensbury Street at its intersection with New Brighton Road.
 - 2. That the Board recommend to Council, that the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the south side of New Brighton Road commencing at its intersection with Fleete Street and extending in a easterly direction for a distance of 27 metres.

Chairperson'sRecommendation:That the aforementioned recommendations be adopted.
