Corporate Plan Output: Consultation - Children	

The purpose of this report is to update the Committee on the progress and implementation of 'What's the Big Idea?!' into Council processes.

BACKGROUND

In Term 1, 1999, 17 Christchurch primary schools, were invited to participate in 'What's the Big Idea?!' Of these, six schools were unable to participate or complete their projects for a variety of reasons, mainly as a result of demands on student and teacher time from other commitments. Eleven schools will successfully complete their project within terms 3 and 4.

What's the Big Idea?' is a project devised by the Christchurch City Council to encourage Christchurch school students in Years 7-8 to find creative ways to strengthen our community. The project was staged as follows:

- 1. Interested teachers attended a workshop and information sharing session at the Christchurch City Council.
- 2. Schools committed to completing the project within an agreed timeframe.
- 3. Students brainstormed to identify an issue or problem in their local or metropolitan area which interested them. They then selected their best idea.
- 4. CDAs liaised with students and staff to assist with the development of their ideas by advising them as to who could help them.
- 5. Students developed a consultation and research plan to gather information from the community about their chosen issue.
- 6. A cost-effective, creative and sustainable solution was presented to their school's local Community Board.
- 7. Community Boards considered the students' presentation and discussed possible implementation. An approximate total of 180 students participated in developing their big idea.
