The draft strategy has been developed as a means of implementing the Council’s Early Childhood Education Policy (adopted in September 1998). The policy and the strategy were informed by the findings of the Early Childhood Education Review 1998, which included extensive consultation. Advocacy Teams have recently been consulted on the draft strategy. The draft strategy, along with any comments from Community Boards is scheduled to be presented to the Community Services Committee on November 29, with a view to seeking its adoption at Council’s December meeting.

The draft strategy clarifies the Council’s role in Early Childhood Education. It does not propose major changes to current funding arrangements. It aims, however, to provide clear guidance on the decision-making processes, with a view to ensuring consistency and equity in dealing with applications from service providers.
