The purpose of this report is to seek Community Board approval to the extension of the refuse collection service down two private rights of way (lanes).

A Council decision (28 May 1997) gave Community Boards the authority to approve any requests which have met the following criteria:

- Lanes to be at least 3.0 metres wide
- Grades of lanes to be not steeper than 1 in 5
- Three tonne capacity trucks must be able to negotiate the lane
- Five or more houses to be down the lane
- Lane to be longer than 80 metres
- Applications from residents are to be unanimous and on the clear understanding that they are responsible for 'wear and tear' on the lane.

Our Community Technical Officer (Martin Julian) confirms that the two applications do comply with the above-listed criteria:

1. Brackenridge Estate

This is a newly developed residential village at Templeton, on the corner of Maddisons and Kirk Roads. There are fourteen houses and an administration block.

2. 34 Hansons Lane

This lane has fourteen Housing Corporation units sited there.

Recommendation: That the Community Board approves the extension of the refuse

collection service into Brackenridge Estate and 34 Hansons Lane.
