The purpose of this report is to provide an evaluation of the Shirley Community Trust After School Programme (ASP) that was funded by the Board last year. A further grant is also requested.

EVALUATION

The programme ran one day per week for the four terms of 1999 with average daily attendance being 10 - 12 children. The supervisor's report (attached) suggests that the programme has been successful and that an extension of the programme would be of benefit to the local community.

FURTHER FUNDING

The Shirley Community Trust would like to extend the programme to two or three days per week and increase the number of children to 20. They are requesting a grant of \$1,000 in the interim to enable the programme to begin in Term I, 2000. A further approach will be made to the Community Board at a later date once decisions regarding the future shape of the programme are made.

- **Recommendation:** That a grant of \$1,000 from Community Services Fund be made to the Shirley Community Trust to enable the After School Programme to continue.
