The purpose of this report is to obtain Board approval for one new right of way name (see attachment).

13 Bassett Street (Burwood Ward)

This subdivision will include a formed and sealed right of way serving 12 new residential allotments. The subdivision adjoins the new subdivision off Baynes Street Board approved the name Anne Ward Lane. which the 31 January meeting this year. The developer of this subdivision also wishes to retain the same historic links with the early settlers of this area. The developer has proposed the name AMELIA LANE to commemorate Amelia Frances Rogers who opened the first Post Office in Burwood, and was founder of the All Saints Sunday School. She was the daughter of Henry Inwood, the first person buried in the All Saints Graveyard. There is a monument in New Brighton Road commemorating Amelia Rogers and the first Post Office.

The second preference is **TOBINS LANE**, (After Cecil Alexander Tobin, the Vicar of All Saints, Burwood, 1910-1937). He was a well-known local identity, playing a significant role in the early history of the Burwood area. He was born in 1856 in Dublin. The second name, Ballytobin commemorates the residence of the family in that part of Dublin. There is an existing street nearby called Robin Street, therefore **BALLYTOBIN LANE** is preferred to Tobins Lane.

The third preference is **ALL SAINTS LANE** in recognition of the adjoining church.

Recommendation: That the Board approve Amelia Lane for the right of way serving

12 new residential allotments at 13 Bassett Street, Burwood.
