The purpose of this report is for the Board to approve the following as its submission on the Christchurch City Council Plan 2000 Edition.

SUBMISSION

The Shirley/Papanui Community Board makes the following submission to the Council Plan 2000 Edition:

1. COMMUNITY BOARDS DISCRETIONARY FUNDING \$300,000 (p.19)

The Board supports the additional funding made available to Community Boards. This funding will be well used in funding:

- community workers for up to three years.
- supporting community workers funded by other community agencies.
- entering partnerships with external agencies, churches, schools, shopping malls to jointly fund/support community workers.
- Fund events and projects provided by community workers.

2. ST ALBANS NEIGHBOURHOOD IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The above plan is currently going through the final stages of consultation and preparation of a final Plan which is expected to be completed within the next two to three months. In order to implement some of the works identified by the community during the process, in 2000/2001, funding is requested to implement the following:

- Change the concrete abutments over the St. Albans Creek to railings. The concrete is unsightly and attracts graffiti. The railings will provide a view from the street along the waterway.
- Develop the Council owned section on the corner of Courtenay/Trafalgar/Westminster Streets as a small neighbourhood reserve area and enhance the waterway running across the back of the section. This section is held for road widening, however in the meantime the local residents wish to be involved in developing the section and waterway. Once developed the residents would maintain the areas as an open space for community use. At present the section is untidy and gets used for dumping rubbish.

3. RETICULATION – STEWARTS GULLY - \$100,000 DRAFT CORPORATE PLAN VOL 111 P 9.2.56

The Board supports the allocation of these monies as part of the cost in a partnership with the property owners of Stewarts Gully to enable connection to the Council's liquid waste reticulation system. This is a similar project to the one the Council participated in with the adjoining Riverlea Estates. With the advent of the Resource Management Act property owners in this area are now able to improve their properties and facilities. The Board feels that it is a reasonable expectation that the property owners can take advantage of basic facilities such as reticulated liquid waste systems and water supply systems especially should those be available at the property boundary.
