The name Aspiring Lane was approved for this right of way by the Board in July this year. There was apparently a lack of communication between the applicant and his consultant. Mr Hides, the applicant, is not happy with the name Aspiring, and has requested that the Board consider two alternative names for which he has provided background. His first preference is CRAIGIEBURN LANE. The Hides family has had fifty-two years of association with ski-ing in the Craigieburn Range. Mr Hides was a foundation member of the Craigieburn Valley Ski Club and originally suggested the name for the Ski Club. The Hides family have been represented on the executive of the club, from its formation to the present. (Mr Hides believes the name is Gaelic for "Hillside above the stream"). The second preference is LONGITUDE LANE. The Hides family is related to John Harrison who solved the problem of determining Longitude in 1720, and the right of way will run from South to magnetic North.
