

## 8. RICCARTON/WIGRAM COMMUNITY AFFAIRS COMMITTEE REPORT OF 16 JULY 2001

### 1. COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARDS

### 2. YOUTH DEVELOPMENT SCHEME

This scheme is to provide financial assistance for the development of young people. The balance of the Youth Development Fund is \$4,000. The following application was received:

- Stephanie Amos – seeking funding towards the costs associated with competing in Inline Hockey tournaments as a member of the Canterbury Cyclones Under 16 team, the Canterbury Cyclones Senior Women's team and the South Island Women's Team.

**Recommendation:** That the Board through the Youth Award Scheme grant \$300 to Stephanie Amos to assist with costs associated with participation in Inline Hockey events.

### 3. CANTERBURY VOLUNTEER CENTRE

A request was received for funding to run an advertisement in a local community newspaper seeking volunteers to join the Canterbury Volunteer Centre.

At the 19 October 2000 meeting of the Committee the Canterbury Volunteer Centre requested funding to have an advertising supplement in the Entertainment Guide of the "Press" to mark the launch of International Year of Volunteers. It was decided at that meeting to decline the request but support an advertisement in the local paper seeking volunteers for the centre at a time that was appropriate to the Canterbury Volunteer Centre.

A copy of the advertisement was tabled. The cost of the advertisement was \$108.90.

**Recommendation:** That the Board support the Canterbury Volunteer Centre with an advertisement in the local newspaper seeking volunteers for the Centre at a cost of \$108.90 from the Community Board's SCAP Fund.

**5. NEIGHBOURHOOD WEEK – 27<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER – 2<sup>ND</sup> NOVEMBER 2001**

The Committee discussed a suggested process for the allocation of funding to groups who wished to hold events to celebrate neighbourhood week.

It was **decided** that applications be considered on individual merit using a figure of \$2 per head, up to a maximum grant of \$300.

Community to be informed by way of flyers to residents groups, neighbourhood support groups, liaison groups and possibly local newspaper advertising during September with a cut off date for applications. The Committee with power to act would then make decisions on the applications. Late applications to be considered by staff and the chairperson using the committees decisions as a guide.

A Children's Colouring Competition will be distributed through the City Scene, service centres etc with judging to take place by each Community Board.

The Community Recreation Adviser will be looking at organising community walks during Neighbourhood Week.

**Recommendation:** That the Board allocate up to \$5,000 from the Community Initiatives Fund to support groups wishing to hold Neighbourhood Week events.
