The purpose of this report is to inform Board members on progress towards implementing the Burwood/Pegasus Youth Recreation Needs Study Implementation Strategy, which was adopted by the Board on 4 September 2000. Information on what has been achieved is listed below under the "Comments" column.

Recommendations from Strategy:

1. Provide a range of hang-out (social interaction areas), casual and active recreation opportunities in and around The Palms (Shirley) and New Brighton Malls.

And

That Council Officers open a dialogue with Mall owners and managers to ensure the inclusion of youth needs within Mall designs or peripheral areas that will offer appropriate and safe recreation opportunities. These opportunities, for example, would include areas for skateboarding, hacky sack, and hanging out.
